Snowball Classic

his year's Snowball was expanded to 2 days. It was held at the Grand Ballroom on Friday, January 24, 1997 and at the Hyatt Regency Hotel on Saturday, January 25, 1997.

One of the reasons for the expansion was that Snowball was running more competition events this year. Not only was there a new category for children, Snowball also hosted the 1997 Canadian Open Amateur Senior Standard competition as well as the 1997 Canadian Open Amateur 10 Dance competition.

Friday was an evening event only

with competitions for children in the Juvenile (under 12 years), Junior (12 to 15 years) and Youth (16 to 18 years) categories and for adults in the Newcomer (limited to couples who have never competed or had only competed once before) and Bronze levels.

The evening was sold out with more than 200 spectators in attendance filling the Grand Ballroom to its brim. The children all looked sharp and captivating with the boys dressed smartly in their white shirts, bow ties and dark pants and the girls in their feathered ballroom gowns and fancy Latin outfits. Although most of the children competitors had been dancing for just over a year and our Nanaimo children couple for only 4 months, they had no trouble maneuvering their way around other couples on the dance floor and at the same time showing the grace and confidence of experienced dancers. The long evening did not seem to exhaust the children, when they were not on the floor, they would be

cheering and yelling out the numbers of their favourite teams which added much joy and excitement to the whole evening.

Other than one children couple competing, we also had two Newcomer couples and one Bronze

couple who all did very well. Our other children couple **Zillion Wong** and **Michaela Konecny** had to withdraw from the competition due to an illness suffered by Michaela.

The major competition events were all held on Saturday at the Hyatt Regency Hotel. The ballroom was bustling with both spectators and dancers in the early

morning hours. The day started at 8:00 a.m. with the first competition event scheduled at 9:00 a.m. The preliminary rounds from Silver to Championship levels were all danced in the daytime with the finals to be danced in the evening. The daytime rounds ended at around 4:30 p.m. which gave the spectators and dancers a break before the evening got under way.

The evening brought a capacity crowd with over a thousand people in attendance. There were competitors from all corners of the globe including Germany, Italy, Norway, England, U.S.A., Hong Kong and Canada. The Canadian contenders consisted of competitors from British Columbia, Quebec, Manitoba, Nova Scotia, Ontario and our neighbouring Province of Alberta. The Championship competition was a show in itself. The competitors were mesmerizing the crowd with their exquisite and sensuous moves in the Latin dances and with their extraordinary smoothness in the Standard dances.

The difference between this event and most of the other competition events was that all competitions were run in the daytime which leaves the evening for people to relax and enjoy. There was a dinner, lots of general dancing and a fabulous and exciting show performed by the 4 times United States Rhythm Champions, Bob Powers and Julia Gorchakova.

Originally, CDTA did not intend to run a children's event. However, I am very happy that they had decided to add the children's event after the idea was suggested to the Co-Chairperson of the Organizing Committee. I am also very grateful to them for scheduling the children's events in the afternoon so as to enable our children couples and their families enough time to travel to Vancouver on the morning of the competition, and not have to incur extra expenses of staying overnight.

Our children couples consisted of **Darryl Wong** and **Robyn-Lynn Ponferrada** (Junior) and **Zillion Wong** and **Michaela Konency** (Juvenile). With over 10 couples in the Junior events, semifinals had to be run. Our Junior couple did very well but were unable to place. Our Juvenile couple, Zillion and Michaela, came home with 3 medals placing 1st in Newcomer Juvenile Latin, 2nd in both Bronze Juvenile Standard and Latin. Way to go, Darryl, Robyn, Zillion and Michaela! Keep it up and who knows, you might be our future Olympians.
